



## Lifetime Achievement Award

### Award Criteria

The Lifetime Achievement Award will recognise an individual or group that has made a significant contribution to community engaged research and community psychology over a sustained period of time. These contributions may assume the form of a new innovation, new knowledge, or ways to improve professional practice and develop theory. Importantly, the contributions should be above and beyond the everyday and have had a long-lasting influence in the field.

#### Eligibility

The Lifetime Achievement Award is an individual or group award in recognition of a person or group's outstanding contributions to the field of community psychology. Nominees must have:

- Demonstrated at least twenty to thirty years of service to the field of community psychology
- Made a long lasting contribution to the field of community psychology and community engaged research
- Exhibited leadership and provided inspiration to others in the field
- Secured grants for community engaged projects
- Contributed to policy, advocacy within continental, national and international academic and other public fora
- Contributed to critical academic scholarship
- Held positions of leadership, such as membership of editorial boards, or chair of committees and community organisations

#### Assessment Criteria

Selection of the nominee is made on the basis of her/his or agency's noteworthy contribution to the field of community engagement and critical community psychology, and the lifelong influence of these contributions to the field. The nominee's contribution to community psychology should be visible through excellent research, refereed publications, success in securing research grants, and the national and international visibility of her/his or agency's profile and projects.

#### The nomination form below should be submitted with a letter of support detailing:

The nature of the nominee's work, specifying the contribution to community psychology by:

- (a) Describing the important theoretical and empirical contributions and their impact on the field that are usually attributed to the nominee
- (b) Comparing the nominee with others in her/his field

### Additional Documents Required

Curriculum Vitae of the nominee; letters of support from at least two scholars familiar with the nominee's work; a list of the nominee's five most significant publications; and five reprints of the nominee's representative work (preferably in electronic format)
